




Number of Patients Tested for COVID-19 by Test Result, New Hampshire





HOSPITALS

emergent & urgent care evolves to include time-sensitive care procedures


- time sensitive MRI or CT scans
- knee or hip replacement for chronic pain
- biopsies and invasive testing





- PPE to Meet Current Need
- •Testing to Meet Current Need
- PPE to Meet Current Need. Conservation measures in place.
- 72 hr. turnaround testing for patients and staff.
- All facilities with clearly articulated policies related to patient COVID screening and testing.
- Hospital capacity of both ICU and non-ICU beds to meet needs of both COVID and Non-COVID patients.
- COVID data for the region has stabilized and is not showing signs of imminent exponential growth.
- Reliable Supply Chain
- 72 hr. turnaround testing for patients and staff.
- 14 days of decreasing community transmission as assessed by Public Health.
- Hospital capacity of both ICU and non-ICU beds to meet needs of both COVID and Non-COVID patients.

Safely Accessing Health Services





immediate

CAMPGROUNDS

- available only to New Hampshire residents & members of private campgrounds
- local towns may choose to close their own public campgrounds
- additional physical distancing restrictions within the campground sites





immediate

PARKS

- seacoast beaches remain closed
- interior state parks remain open with adequate staffing
- amplified universal health and safety guidance will be provided regarding interior state parks





immediate

MANUFACTURING

- remains an essential industry
- provided universal guidance to all new hampshire employers and employees so they can continue to operate safely





may 11

GOLF

- specific guidance to allow for public & private golf courses to open
- participation limited to NH residents & members of private clubs
- use of clubhouses is prohibited with restrictions on food & beverage





may 11

BARBERS & HAIR SALONS

- by reservation only with limited open chairs
- no congregating within establishments
- face coverings provisions for both employees & customers





may 11

RETAIL

- 50% occupancy within interior locations
- PPE provisions for employees
- strict sanitation guidelines on top of other universal guidelines and requirements





may 11

DRIVE-IN THEATERS

- theaters allow for proper social distancing
- additional guidelines on food
 & beverage restrictions
- restrictions on congregation around bathrooms and other accommodations





may 18

RESTAURANTS

- take out as well as outdoor seating options
- tables must be 6 ft. apart, limited to 6 individuals
- servers must wear face coverings
- must adhere to regulations crafted with the Department of Public Health and the NH Restaurants & Lodging Association
